- SIGNED and inscribed by the author to the title page. Dr. Henry Morgentaler was a Polish born Canadian physician, Holocaust survivor and a pro-choice activist. His battles with the Quebec judicial authorities led to landmark rulings and established important judicial precedents (namely, The Morgentaler Amendment). In R v Morgentaler, The Supreme Court of Canada struck down the 1969 abortion law under which Morgentaler was charged. The court also declared the statute in violation of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms and thus unconstitutional. (#231)
