William West Kirkby (1827-1907) was an English-born, Oxford educated Anglican missionary serving in Northern Canada chiefly in Yukon Territory to the "Loucheux" (Gwich'in people). He is notable for his early translation of The New Testament into the Chipewyan language part of the Northern Athabaskan language family. Karen Evans in 'Masinahikan' notes a similar copy with different pagination (pp. 196) and, which is illustrated.
